Youth Voter Turnout




Voter Turnout 2011-2015

42nd General Election


In the 42nd general election, voting increased across all age groups, with the largest increase among youth 18-24.



Teaching Democracy

- Educators as civic influencers in the classroom

 - A higher likelihood of voting
